**Sub: Guidelines of Examination and Promotion for Classes III to VIII
w.e.f. Academic Session 2023-24**

Refer notification No DE.23(92)/RTE/2019/151-165 dated 23/06/2022 issued by Director (Education), Govt. of NCT of Delhi regarding Rule 21 A, "the manner and conditions subject to which a child can be held back under sub-section (3) of section 16" inserted after Rule 21 under Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Rules, 2011 & The Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education (Amendment) Act, 2019.

Further, as per the notification No.F.23/DE/RTE/2012-13/229-243 of the Government of NCT of Delhi dated 28/06/2012 which states- "in exercise of powers conferred by section 38 of the Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Act, 2009 (35 of 2009), the Lt. Governor hereby declares—State Council of Educational Research and Training, Delhi (SCERT) as the "Academic Authority" for the purposes of Section 29 of the Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Act, 2009 and rule 21 of the Delhi Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Rules, 2011".

Section 29 of Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Act 2009 states "The curriculum and the evaluation procedure for elementary education shall be laid down by an academic authority to be specified by the appropriate Government, by notification".

In view of the above and in conformity with the recommendations of SCERT Delhi, the Examination Guidelines for classes III to VIII and Promotion Guidelines for classes V & VIII are hereby issued.

The guidelines will be implemented in all the Govt., Govt Aided, Municipal Corporation of Delhi, New Delhi Municipal Council, Delhi Cantonment board and Recognized Un-Aided Schools within NCT of Delhi from the Academic Session 2023-24.

All the Heads of aforesaid schools are hereby directed to follow these Guidelines of Examination & Promotion in letter and spirit. Students and their parents should be explained the entire process and be informed that these guidelines shall come into force from the next academic session i.e. the session 2023-24.

Guidelines of Examination & Promotion w.e.f. Academic Session 2023-24

1. General Guidelines:

- 1.1. As per The Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education (Amendment) Act, 2020, for section 16 (4) "No child shall be expelled from a school till the completion of Elementary Education".

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- 1.2. As per section 16 (1), "There shall be a regular examination in the fifth class and in the eighth class at the end of every academic year".
- 1.3. As per section 16 (2), If a child fails in the examination referred to in sub-section(1), he/she shall be given additional instructions and granted opportunity for Re-Examination within a period of two months from the date of declaration of the result.
- 1.4. Assessment of classes III, IV, VI & VII will be done on the same examination pattern as of classes V & VIII and the students of classes third, fourth, sixth and seventh will not be held back in the same class.
- 1.5. Academic Session for classes III to VIII will have assessment as Mid Term Examinations (September/ October) & Annual Examinations (February/ March).
- 1.6. Pen and paper examination of classes III to VIII will be conducted. These examinations will test the achievements of basic learning outcomes, through assessment of core concepts and knowledge from the National & Local Curricula along with the relevant higher order skills and application of knowledge in real life situations, rather than the rote memorization.
- 1.7. Examinations shall be conducted in such a manner that chances of copying, favouritism, injustice and victimization be reduced to the minimum.
- 1.8. A summary of the analysis of class wise and subject wise results shall be prepared and kept in record to serve as an input for academic enrichment and remedial purpose.
- 1.9. In case of local transfer of students, record of marks obtained in the Mid Term Examination, if any, in the previous school shall be taken into account.
- 1.10. In case of transfer from areas outside Delhi, marks obtained in subsequent exam shall be adjusted proportionately as per the weightage of marks.
- 1.11. In case of a natural calamity like floods, epidemics, riots or other such events in an area resulting in cancellation of Exam(s) in one or more subjects under orders of the Deputy Director of Education (District), marks in the subjects of the students studying in schools located in the affected areas or residing in the affected areas shall be adjusted proportionately based on the assessment record available in the school, with the approval of the Director (Education) and the results be declared accordingly.
- 1.12. Fraction of the marks will be rounded off as per mathematical formula in all the subjects and classes, for example: 8.1 to 8.4 will be rounded off to 8.0 and 8.5 to 8.9 rounded off to 9.0.

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2.2 The question papers will be provided in the form of Question Paper Booklets along with space for answering the questions in the booklets itself.

3.2 The Question Papers for the Annual Examinations will be set out of the whole syllabus, covered in first term and second term.

4 Parameters of Internal Assessment:

The activities given in each parameter are suggestive and need to be assessed as per students Participation, Facilitation, Organisation, Data collection, Analysis and Inference making skills etc. Student may choose activity from any parameter, However one activity can be considered for one parameter only.

Fraction of the attendance will be rounded off as per mathematical formula in all the cases, for example: 78.1 to 78.4 will be rounded off to 78.0 and 78.5 to 78.9 rounded off to 79.0.

4.2 **Subject Enrichment –5 Marks:-** These activities are defined as the activities leading to experiential learning integrated with each subject and leading to subject enrichment of the child. Child shall be engaged in activities based on the content that connects different areas of knowledge, application and values with their own lives and the world around. The assessment under this is done as follows:

4.3 Project Based Activities – 05 Marks:-

Project Based Activities are instructional approaches designed to give students the opportunity to develop knowledge and skills through engaging projects set around challenges and problems they may face in the real world. Project Based Activities provide an opportunity for students to engage deeply with the targeted content with a focus on long-term retention. These activities facilitate the development of key skills like: Identification of Problems, Logical Thinking, Creativity, Inference Making and Problem Solving.

4.4 Portfolio - 05 Marks:

The Portfolio is to broaden the scope of learning and achieve diverse curriculum outcomes by examining a range of evidence of student performances being assessed.

It is a purposeful collection of intentionally chosen student's work representing a selection of performances that is assembled over time and describes the learner's efforts, progress, growth and achievement in key areas learning outcomes.

It is a tool for assessing a variety of skills not usually testable in a single setting of the traditional written paper and pencil tests. Assessment will include self and peer assessment among others like achievement of student in the subject, reflections, narrations, etc. It holds the performance records and documents which represents a collection of their learning achievements. As a process, it enables learners to monitor their own learning systematically, reflect on their performance, redirect their efforts and set future goals.

4.5 Multiple Assessments- 05 Marks:

Multiple Assessment is aimed at evaluating the performance of the learner more comprehensively & regularly and provide schools/ teachers flexibility to use multiple and diverse techniques to assess learners viz. observation, oral tests, individual or group work, class discussion, quizzes, concept maps, exit cards, visual expressions, Listening and Speaking Skills etc as per the demand of the subject and the context towards addressing the goal of assessment for and as learning.

4.6 Periodic Tests/Unit Tests - 05 Marks :

Periodic Tests/Unit tests will be conducted at school level in the first two periods, pattern of which will be same as term end examination.

5. External Examinations (Pen & Paper Exam i.e. Mid Term & Annual Examinations):- These examinations will test achievements of basic learning outcomes, through assessment of core concepts and knowledge from the National & Local Curricula along with the relevant Higher Order Skills and applications of knowledge in real life situations rather than the rote memorisation.

6. Co-Scholastic Areas:

Schools shall promote co-curricular activities for the holistic development of the students. These activities will be graded on a 3-point grading scale (A to C).

Social & Emotional Skills are a subset of an individual ability, attributes and characteristics that are important for individual success and social functioning. They encompass behavioural dispositions, internal states approaches to task and management and control of behavioural feeling.

7. Documentation:

Records pertaining to the Subject Enrichment, Portfolio, Multiple Assessment, Mid Term Exam & Annual School Examination etc. of the students done by the schools will be maintained for a period of one year from the date of declaration of result for verification at the discretion of the Department/Board. Subjudice cases, if any or those involving RTI/ Grievances may however, be retained till the decision of the case.

8. Promotion Guidelines for Classes - V & VIII w.e.f. Academic Session 2023-24

8.1 Passing Criteria For Class-V:

8.1.1. In order to be declared “Pass” at the end of the session for promotion to the next higher class, a student must secure at least 33% marks in each subject studied by him /her during the session. He/she must secure overall 33% marks i.e. 33 marks out of 100 [Marks of the attendance of the student (05 marks) plus marks of Subject Enrichment (05 marks) plus marks of Project Based Activities (05 Marks) plus marks of Portfolio (05 marks) plus marks of Multiple Assessment (05 marks) plus marks of Unit Test/Periodic Tests (05 marks) plus marks of Mid Term Exam (20 marks) and Annual Examination (50 marks) put together].

8.1.2. The promotion to the next higher class is also subject to the condition that a minimum of 25% of marks must be scored in Mid Term Examinations plus Annual Examination i.e. 18 marks out of 70 in each subject.

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8.1.3. A candidate not eligible to be declared "Pass" will be declared "Promoted" at the end of the session of a class provided he/she is entitled for grace marks as admissible under **rule 8.1.4** of these rules.

8.1.4. **Grace marks** up to maximum of 10 in all, shall be awarded to a student to reach the minimum required 33% of marks in each subject, provided that:-

8.1.4. (i) A minimum of 25% of marks are secured in each subject in Mid Term Examination + Annual Examination i.e. 18 marks out of 70 Marks to make him/her eligible for promotion.

8.1.4. (ii) Provided that he/she does not require more than 05 marks in one subject to come up to the minimum required of 33% of marks in that subject.

8.2 Passing Criteria For Class-VIII:

8.2.1. In order to be declared "Pass" at the end of the session for promotion to the next higher class, a student must secure at least 33% marks in each subject studied by him /her during the session. He/she must secure overall 33% marks i.e. 33 marks out of 100 [Marks of the attendance of the student (05 marks) plus marks of Subject Enrichment (05 marks) plus marks of Project Based Activities (05 Marks) plus marks of Portfolio (05 marks) plus marks of Multiple Assessment Tests (05 marks) plus marks of Unit Test/Periodic Tests (05 marks) plus marks of Mid Term Exam (20 marks) and Annual Examination (50 marks) put together].

8.2.2. The promotion to the next higher class will also be subject to the condition that a minimum of 25% of marks be scored in each subject in Annual Examination i.e. 13 marks out of 50.

8.2.3. A candidate not eligible to be declared "Pass" will be declared "Promoted" at the end of the session of a class provided he/she is entitled for grace marks as admissible under rule 8.2.4 of these rules.

8.2.4. **Grace marks** up to maximum of 10 in all, shall be awarded to a student to reach the minimum required 33% of marks in each subject:-

8.2.4 (i) Provided that a minimum of 25% of marks are secured in each subject in the Annual Examination i.e. 13 marks out of 50 Marks to make him/her eligible for promotion.

8.2.4 (ii) Provided that he/she does not require more than 05 marks in one subject to come up to the minimum required of 33% of marks in that subject.

8.3 Re-Examination For Classes V & VIII:

8.3.1. A candidate who appears in Annual Examination can be declared eligible for appearing at the Re-Examination in all the failing subject(s). Such a candidate will be eligible to appear in the subject(s) at a subsequent examination to be held within a period of two months from the date of declaration of the result known as the "Re-Examination".

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8.3.2. Re- Examination will be conducted on the same syllabus and pattern as of Annual Examination i.e. two hours duration and 50 marks for class V and two and half hours duration and 60 marks for class VIII. Weightage of Marks obtained by the student in Re-Examination will be proportionately calculated out of 70 marks.

8.3.3. Marks obtained in the attendance of the student (05 marks) plus marks of Subject Enrichment (05 marks) plus marks of Project Based Activities (05 Marks) plus marks of Portfolio (05 marks) plus marks of Multiple Assessment (05 marks) plus marks of Periodic Tests/Unit Tests (05 marks) will be carried forward and added with the marks obtained by the student in the Re-Examination.

8.3.4. In order to be declared "Pass" in Re-Examination, a student will have to secure at least 25% marks in the subject(s) in which he/she has taken the Re-Examination i.e. 18 marks out of 70, provided that a minimum of 33 marks out of 100 marks are secured in total i.e. Marks of Re-Examination (70 marks) plus marks obtained in the internal assessment (30 marks) i.e. {Attendance of the student (05 marks) plus marks of Subject Enrichment (05 marks) plus marks of Project Based Activities (05 Marks) plus marks of Portfolio (05 marks) plus marks of Multiple Assessment (05 marks) plus marks of Periodic Tests/ Unit Tests (05 marks)}.

8.3.5. No benefit of the grace marks will be given to the student appearing in Re-Examination for the promotion to the next higher class.

9. **Criteria for Essential Repeat:**

9.1 If a student does not secure at least 25% marks in the subject(s) in which he/she has taken the Re-Examination and minimum of 33 out of 100 marks in that subject(s) or does not appear in the Re-Examination , he/she will be placed in the category of "**Essential Repeat**" (ER).

9.2 A student of Class V & VIII who is not eligible for Pass, Promotion and placed in the category of "Essential Repeat" (ER) will be held back in the same class during the next session.

10. **Rules Regarding Absence during Examination:**

10.1. Absence in the examination or part thereof without medical certificate to be submitted within three working days of the date of absence in the exam will be considered as wilful absence and no mark, credit or allowance will be given for the days of absence.

10.2. In case a student is unable to appear in Mid Term Examination in one or more subjects on medical ground (duly supported by a medical certificate as per circular NoDE.5/43/04/2013-14/Exam/1553-1558 dated 13/07/2015) issued by a registered medical practitioner or due to Late Admission(Duly approved by the Competent Authority)/ Participating in National/ State,

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International Games & Sports, any National Festival or Programme ,Duly approved by the DDE (Sports), the Mid Term Exam will be ignored for computation of his/her result and promotion to the next higher class at the end of the session will be made on the basis of Internal Assessment & External Assessment.

10.3. A student on leave on medical grounds (duly supported by a medical certificate as per circular No. DE.5/43/04/2013-14/Exam/1553-1558 dated 13/07/2015 issued by a registered medical practitioner or Participating in National, State, International Games & Sports, any National Festival or Programme with due approval of the DDE (Sports) in one or more subjects in the Annual Examination will be allowed to take the exam in the subject(s) (In which he/she had been on leave on medical grounds or participating in events as mentioned above) along with the students taking the Re- Examination.

10.4. For such subjects (Students will appear with candidates appearing for Re-Examination), rules of the Re-Examination will be applicable for promotion to the next higher class.

11 Attendance Criteria for Classes V & VIII

11.1. Student will not ordinarily be eligible to appear in Annual Exam, if he/she has not put in at least 75% actual attendance of the total attendance during the session up to the date of Annual Exam. The attendance for the session will be counted for the working days from the date of admission.

11.2. While calculating the percentage of actual attendance during the session, a student's actual attendance and total attendance in the previous school(s), if any, during the current session will invariably be added to his actual attendance and the total attendance in the present school.

11.3. If the date of commencement of the session in the State or UT from where the student has migrated, is different from the date of commencement of the session in the National Capital Territory of Delhi, the total and actual attendance will be counted from the actual date of commencement of the session in that State/UT.

11.4. Actual attendance with respect to the total attendance will be intimated with the exam results to the parent or the guardian.

11.5. Percentage of attendance for each student will be computed before Mid Term Exam. In case of shortage of attendance in Mid Term Exam, the student will be allowed to take the exam on an undertaking from the parents or the guardian as well as from the student that the student will in future be regular and will make up the shortage in attendance. He or she, however, will be allowed to appear at the Annual Exam only under the provision of instructions of these guidelines.

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
- 11.6. If the shortage of attendance at the time of the Annual Examination is not more than 10%, in special circumstances of the case and if the Head of the School is satisfied with the genuineness of the reasons submitted by the student and his/her parent or guardian in written application for condonation of shortage to take the Annual Exam, the shortage of attendance up to 10% may be condoned by concerned Head of School. Application for condonation of shortage of attendance will be submitted by the parent or the guardian of the student to the Head of the school by the last day of January.
- 11.7. If the shortage of attendance at the time of Annual Examination is more than 10% but not more than 15% and the Head of the school is satisfied with the genuineness of the reasons of shortage submitted by the student and his parents or guardian, the Head of School may recommend, giving concrete and satisfactory reasons in writing thereof, his case for condonation of shortage of attendance to the DDE(Zone) concerned who may approve such condonation at his discretion and allow.
- 11.8. Application for condonation of attendance will be submitted by the parent or the guardian of the student to the Head of school by the last day of January.
- 11.9. If the shortage of attendance at the time of the Annual Examination, for whatever reason or reasons, is more than 15%, i.e. the actual attendance of the student is less than 60% of the total attendance during the session, condonation of the shortage of attendance will not be allowed, the student will not be eligible to appear in the Annual Examination and will be detained except in such cases as mentioned in the instructions.
- 11.10. The Director (Education), at his/her discretion, may make any further condonation in the required minimum attendance percentage as a condition of eligibility to appear in the Annual Examination in exceptional circumstances created on medical grounds, such as student suffering from serious diseases like Cancer, AIDS, TB or similar serious disease requiring long period of hospitalization or any other extra ordinary circumstances.
- 11.11. The Director (Education), at his/her discretion, may also make further relaxation in the required minimum attendance percentage as a condition of eligibility to appear in the Annual Examination in case of natural calamities like floods, earthquakes, epidemics etc. or in cases of disruption of studies due to riots or other such events in respect of students of schools located in the affected areas or the students residing in such areas provided that such a calamity had disturbed normal life in the concerned area.
- 11.12. Head of School will ensure that no student of classes V & VIII (Below the attendance of 60%) will appear in the examination without the approval of the Director (Education).

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12. All the Govt, Govt Aided and Recognized Un-Aided Schools are required to comply with these instructions and no dilution of the criteria prescribed is permissible under any circumstances.

13. All the Govt, Govt Aided and Recognized Un-Aided Schools will bring these instructions to the notice of the students and their parents/guardians immediately within 15 days of issuing this order and on the commencement of the session.

**Sub: Promotion Policy for Classes III to IX & XI w.e.f. Academic
Session 2022-23**

In continuation of Order No- DE.5/212/Exam/16-17/Part-1/365-374 dated 01/07/2022 issued by the Directorate of Education, Delhi regarding Examination & Assessment Guidelines for Classes III to IX & XI w.e.f. Academic Session 2022-23, all the Heads of Govt., Govt. Aided and Recognized Unaided Schools are hereby informed that examination guidelines (as prescribed in the aforementioned order) have already been implemented in all the schools running under Directorate of Education, Delhi. Promotion Rules for classes III to IX & XI as mentioned below are promulgated from the Academic Session 2022-23:

1. Promotion Rules for classes I to VIII:

- (a) There is no change in the Promotion Rules of classes I to VIII. Enrolled students who appear in both the Terminal Examinations (Mid Term & Annual Examinations) will be promoted to the next higher class under "No Detention Policy" as per RTEA-2009.
- (b) If a student does not appear in all the subjects in both the Terminal Examinations i.e Mid Term & Annual Exam, he/she will be placed in the category of "With held due to Long Absent".
- (c) If a student appears in one or more subjects, and remains absent in other subject(s), in any of the Terminal Examinations i.e. Mid Term or Annual Exam, he/she will be provisionally promoted subject to the condition of "To Appear in Mid Term or Annual Exam.
- (d) If a student appears in all the subjects in Mid Term & Annual Exam, he/she will be declared "Promoted".

2. Promotion Rules For Classes IX & XI:

Promotion Rules circulated as per Order No DE./5/212/Exam/16-17/1373-81 dated 09/10/2019 for classes IX & XI shall be executed henceforth from the Academic Session 2022-23 onwards. Copy of the order is enclosed herewith for ready reference.

3. All the Heads of Govt., Govt Aided and Recognized Un-Aided Schools are hereby directed to comply with all these Promotion Rules and no dilution of the criteria prescribed is permissible under any circumstances.

4. All the Govt., Govt Aided and Recognized Un-Aided Schools shall bring these instructions in to the notice of the teachers, students and their parents/guardians immediately on the commencement of the session and in any case, within 15 days of the issue of this order.

**Sub: Strengthening Assessment & Evaluation Practices and
Promotion Policy for Classes IX to XII w.e.f. Academic Session
2019-20**

Central Board of Secondary Education has made some changes in the Assessment and Evaluation Practices at Secondary and Senior Secondary level for the year 2019-20 onwards to strengthen the current evaluation process and align to the future requirements of the learners.

In the light of changes made by CBSE, Directorate of Education, Govt. Of NCT of Delhi has reframed the Assessment & Evaluation Practices and Promotion Policy with immediate effect and the following changes have been made so as to bring uniformity in the Assessment and Evaluation from the Academic Session 2019-20.

1. Strengthening Assessment & Evaluation Practices and Promotion Policy

- (a) Academic Session for classes IX and XI has been divided into two terms. First Term and Second Term. Nomenclature of the examination of both the terms will be Mid Term Examination to be held in September / October and Common Annual School Examination (CASE) i.e. End Term Exam for Class IX & XI to be held in February / March and Board Exam for Class X & XII.
- (b) The question papers for the Mid Term Examination in class IX and XI would be set out of the syllabus supposed to be covered up to the Mid Term.
- (c) Whole syllabus will be covered in Annual Examination/ Board Examination of classes IX to XII.
- (d) Question papers in Mid Term Exam, Pre Board Exam & Annual Exam shall be set in such a manner that they really test the comprehension and other skills as required. Normally, the pattern of questions particularly in Secondary and Sr. Secondary Classes shall be the same as that of the questions set at the CBSE examinations.
- (e) Examinations shall be conducted in such a manner that chances of copying, favouritism, injustice and victimization shall be reduced to the minimum.

- (f) The result of each examination shall be analyzed and weak areas in various subjects as well as weak and meritorious students in different subjects are identified and remedial and enrichment programmes are arranged accordingly.
- (g) A summary of the analysis of class wise and subject wise results shall be prepared and kept on record to serve as an input to academic enrichment and remedial purpose.

2. Examination Pattern for Classes IX & X

- (a) A student shall not be eligible to appear in the Secondary School Examination of the Board at the end of class X unless he/she has passed in the third language in class VIII. Those students who could not clear the third language in class VIII and have been promoted to class IX shall be examined by the concerned school at the end of the year exam of class IX in the same syllabus and text books as prescribed for class VIII. Those who are still unable to clear the third language at the end of class IX may be given another opportunity in class X before the Board Examination.
- (b) Mid Term Examination for class IX will be held in September/ October. This will be of three hours duration and 80 marks. Weightage of the Mid Term Exam will be of 20 Marks. The question papers would be set out of the syllabus supposed to be covered up to the Mid Term.
- (c) Annual Examination for class IX will be held in February/ March. This will be of three hours duration and 80 marks. The weightage of the Annual Exam will be of 60 Marks. The question papers would be set out of the whole syllabus.

gradually increasing portion of content. Hence, they also tend to prepare students for external pen and paper exams in a more confident manner. The question papers for the assessments would be prepared and printed by the school.

(b) Multiple Assessment (05 Marks):

Multiple Assessment as a part of Internal Assessment, is aimed at evaluating the performance of the learner more comprehensively and provide schools/ teachers flexibility to use multiple and diverse techniques to assess learners viz. observation, oral tests, individual or group work, class discussion, field work, concept maps, graphic organizers, visual representations etc. Hence the schools are given autonomy to use alternate mode of assessment as per the demand of the subject and the context towards addressing the goal of assessment for and as learning.

(c) Portfolio (05 Marks):

The creation of portfolios is suggested to broaden the scope of learning and achieve diverse curriculum outcomes by examining a range of evidence of student performances being assessed.

1. A portfolio is a purposeful collection of intentionally chosen student's work representing a selection of performances that is assembled over time and describes the learner's efforts, progress, growth and achievement in key areas learning outcomes. It is a tool for assessing a variety of skills not usually testable in a single setting of the traditional written pen and paper tests. Assessment would include self and peer assessment among others.
2. For a more simple approach in the first year, it is suggested that the portfolio take the form of a journal or notebook that would include besides class work, students artifacts selected within a coherent framework along with their reflections. Learner here is an active participant involved in constructing his or

her journey through the portfolio building process of selecting, organizing and reflecting.

3. It is suggested that the portfolios be an extension of note books developed subject-wise. They would include class work and homework assignments that would help evaluate learner's progress. Besides this, portfolio should be a space for student to display his/her exemplary work in the related area. The attention should be to promote techniques such as annotation, identification of key words / topics / themes, summarization and organization of ideas and content.

(d) Subject Enrichment Activities (05 Marks):

These are subject specific application activities aimed at enrichment of the understanding and skill development. These activities provide opportunity to students to explore their own interests as well along with an understanding of the nature of particular discipline. These are to be recorded internally by the concerned subject teachers.

For Languages: Activities conducted under Subject Enrichment in Languages should aim at equipping the learner to develop effective speaking and listening skills.

For Mathematics: The listed laboratory activities and projects as given in the prescribed publications of CBSE/NCERT may be followed. Students need to be encouraged to raise questions, generate hypotheses, experiment, innovate and find solutions to questions/problems encountered.

For Science: The practical works / activities may be carried out as prescribed by the CBSE in the curriculum.

For Social Science: Map and project work may be undertaken as prescribed by the CBSE in the curriculum. Projects may be related to art and culture including development of life skills.

Discipline (Attendance, Sincerity, Behaviour, Punctuality, Values):

Discipline significantly impacts career shaping and it helps build character. Sincerity, Good Behaviour and Values Develop Strength and foster unity and co-operation. Concept of discipline should not be confused with strict authoritarian environment and the students should be given freedom to share their doubts and ideas with teachers regarding class teachers work. Constitutional and universal values should also be encouraged amongst students. Hygiene, sanitation, dedication, honesty, truthfulness, kindness, empathy, respect for the environment, elders and all living things etc. are the values that our students must actively practice. Class teacher will be responsible for grading the students on a Five-point scale (A to E).

Documentation:

Records pertaining to the Internal Assessment of the students done by the schools will be maintained for a period of one year from the date of declaration of result for verification at the discretion of the Department/Board. Sub judicial cases, if any or those involving RTI/ Grievances may, however, be retained till the decision of the case.

Promotion Rules For Class IX w.e.f. Academic Session 2019-20

4. Passing Criteria:

- Promotion to the next higher class shall be decided on the basis of the cumulative result of the average marks of best two Periodic Tests out of three (05 marks), Multiple Assessment (05 marks), Portfolio (05 marks), Subject Enrichment Activities (05 marks), Mid Term Exam (20 Marks) and Annual Examination (60 marks) Total Marks 100 in each subject of class IX.
- In order to be declared "Pass" at the end of the session, a student must secure at least 33% marks in each of the five main subjects i.e. Two languages and three compulsory subjects Mathematics, Natural Science, Social Science studied by him /her during the session. He/she must secure overall 33% marks i.e. 33 marks out of 100 [Internal Assessment (20 Marks) and External Assessment. (80 Marks) put together]. The promotion is also subject to the condition that a minimum of 25% of marks should be secured in Annual Exam i.e. out of 60 Marks.



(c) As per CBSE guidelines, the following specific exemptions/concessions have been given to the Students with Disabilities:

- i. Students with Disabilities as defined in The Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act 2016 will be exempted from third language.
- ii. Students with Disabilities have the option of studying one compulsory language as against two. This language should be in consonance with the overall spirit of the Three Language Formula prescribed by the CBSE. Besides one language any four from amongst the following groups can be offered:

Group-1

Mathematics, Science, Social Science, another language, Music (Any One), Painting, Home Science, Elements of Business, Elements of Book Keeping and Accountancy, Computer Applications

Group-2 Any One Skill Subject- Retail, Information Technology, Security, Automotive, Introduction To Financial Markets, Introduction to Tourism, Beauty & Wellness, Agriculture, Food Production, Front Office Operations, Banking & Insurance, Marketing & sales, Health Care, Apparel, Media, Multi Skill Foundation Course, Artificial Intelligence, (Except Automotive) for regular students only.


Note-Information Technology from group-2 cannot be offered if Computer Applications from group-1 is opted.

(d) A student will have to obtain the required 33% passing marks in any two of the three languages in order to get promotion to the next higher class i.e. 33 marks out of 100 [Internal Assessment (20 Marks) and External Assessment (80 Marks) put together]. In case a student does not secure 33% marks, in any one language, he/she shall have to appear and pass in exam for improvement in that language along with the compartment examination to qualify for appearing in class X in that language.

(e) Further, Skill Course subjects opted by the student will not replace any elective subject i.e. Maths, Natural Science, Social Science, Music, Home Science and Painting.

(f) In order to be declared pass in the subjects under Skill Courses and subjects involving Practical, a student has to secure 33% marks in Practical and Theory Exam separately.

~~(g) A student not eligible to be declared "Pass" shall be declared "Promoted" at the end of the session of a class provided he/she is entitled for grace marks as admissible under instruction 5 of these rules.~~

- (h) In case a student does not score 33% marks in any one language i.e. language-1 or language-2 [below 33% marks of total marks 100], third language opted and qualified (Scored 33% marks and above) by the student will replace either language-1 or language-2 only for promotion to the next higher class.
- (i) In case a student does not score 33% marks in both the languages i.e. language-1 or language-2 [below 33% marks of total marks 100], third language opted and qualified (Scored 33% marks and above) by a student will not replace for grant of Compartment in one language.
- (j) In case a student does not score 33% marks in one language either language-1 or language-2 [below 33% marks of total marks 100] and submits Medical/ absent in other language or vice-versa, third language opted and qualified (Scored 33% marks and above) by a student will not replace any language.

5. Grace Marks:

- (a) Grace marks up to maximum of 10 in all, shall be awarded to a student to reach the minimum required 33% of marks in each subject, provided that a minimum of 25% of marks are secured in each subject at the Annual Examination to make him/her eligible for promotion, provided he/she does not require more than 05 marks in one subject to come up to the minimum required of 33% of marks in that subject. However, no grace marks shall be awarded to a student for taking the Compartment Examination.
- (b) Grace marks may be given in any subject(s) after the replacement of any one language 1 or 2 (In case of failing subject) by the Third Language.
- (c) In case, total 10 grace marks are not awarded in five main subjects then rest of grace marks may be awarded to Skill Courses Subject & Language-3/ Any other Academic subject for making it qualify to appear in Board Exam, if required.

6. Compartment Examination:

- (a) A student who appears in the Annual Examination can be declared eligible for appearing at the Compartment Examination in not more than **two failing subjects**. Such a student shall be eligible to appear in the subject(s) at a subsequent examination to be held in the third week of April known as "Compartment Examination". Students who are required to appear and pass in the exam for improvement in the third language/ Skill Courses, to qualify for appearing in class X in that subject, may appear along with the students placed in the Compartment.
- (b) The Compartment Examination will be conducted on the same pattern of Annual Examination i.e. three hours duration and 80 marks.



(c) Marks of the Internal Assessment/Practical will be carried forward and added with the marks obtained by the student in the Compartment Examination.

(d) If a student fails/ is absent in one or two subjects and Medical leave in other one or more subjects, he/she will be eligible for Compartment Examination in the subjects for which he/she has submitted the medical certificate as per norms along with the failing one/two subjects only.

(e) If a student fails/ is absent in three or more than three subjects and Medical leave in other one or more subjects, he/she shall not be eligible to appear in Compartment Examination.

(f) Benefit of the 3rd language (Additional Subject) (replacing language 1 or 2) will be given to the student only for the promotion to the next higher class, not for placing in compartment.

7. Passing Criteria For Compartment Examination:

(a) (i) In order to be declared "Successful" in Compartment Examination, a student must secure at least 33% marks in the subject(s) in which he/she has taken the Compartment Examination.

(ii) Provided that a minimum of 33 out of 100 marks must be secured in total i.e. Marks of Compartment Examination plus marks of Internal Assessment.

(b) In order to be declared pass in the Skill Courses Subjects and the subject - Music, Home Science & Painting involving Practical, a student has to secure 33% marks in Practical and Theory Exam separately.

(c) (i) If a student does not secure in the subject(s) in which he/she has taken the Compartment Examination, at least 33% marks in the subject of Compartment and minimum of 33 out of 100 marks in that subject, he/she shall be declared unsuccessful in the Examination.

(ii) If a student does not secure in the subject(s) involving practical in which he/she has taken the Compartment Examination, at least 33% marks in Practical and Theory (Compartment Exam) separately, he/she shall be declared unsuccessful in the Examination.

(d) No benefit of the grace marks / replacement of the language will be given to the student appearing in Compartment Examination.

8. Fail:

A student of Class IX who is not eligible for Pass, Promotion or Compartment Examination either at the end of the session or for passing at the Compartment Examination, shall be declared "Fail" and detained in the same class during the next session.

10. Instructions for Selecting the Subjects Combination:

(a) Hindi or English must be one of the two languages to be studied in classes XI and XII. Hindi and English can also be offered simultaneously. In Hindi and in English, two courses are being offered for class XI and XII. Keeping in view the varying backgrounds of the students, a student may either opt for Hindi (Elective) code No 002 or Hindi (Core) code No 302 and English (Elective) code No 001 or English (Core) code No 301. However, same language cannot be offered both at Core and elective levels.



- (b) Class XI and XII is an integrated course. Students need to take only those subjects (Valid Subject Combinations issued by CBSE) in class XI which they intend to continue in class XII.
- (c) Physics (042) and Applied Physics (838) cannot be taken together.
- (d) Chemistry (Code 043) and Applied Chemistry (Code 839) cannot be taken together.
- (e) Mathematics (Code 041) and Applied Mathematics cannot be taken together.
- (f) Business Studies (Code 054) and Business Administrations (Code 833) cannot be taken together.

11. Promotion Rules for Class XI

- (a) In order to be declared "Pass" at the end of the session, a student must secure at least 33% marks in each of the five main subjects excluding additional subject studied by him /her during the session subject to the condition that he/she secures 33% marks separately in theory and in Practical Work/ Project Work/ Assessment of Speaking & Listening Skills (ASL)/ Communicative Skills etc also. The promotion is also subject to the condition that a minimum of 25% of marks should be secured in each subject out of five main subjects in Annual Exam.
- (b) A student not eligible to be declared "passed" shall be declared promoted at the end of the session of a class provided he/she is entitled for grace marks as admissible under instruction 12 of these rules.

12. Grace Marks:

- (a) Grace marks up to maximum of 10 in all, shall be awarded to a student to reach the minimum required 33% of marks in each subject, provided that a minimum of 25% of marks are secured in each subject at the Annual Examination as per Rule 11 (a) to make him/her eligible for promotion.
- (b) Provided that he/she does not require more than 05 marks in one subject to come up to the minimum required of 33% of marks in that subject. However, no grace marks shall be awarded to a student for taking the Compartment Examination.

13. Compartment Examination:

- (a) A student who is eligible to take the Annual Examination in order to be declared pass can be declared eligible for appearing at the Compartment Examination in **one failing subject**.
- (b) Out of the five main subjects, a student who fails in Theory, he/she will be placed in Compartment in Theory. If a student who fails in Practical will be placed in compartment only in Practical.
- (c) A student who is eligible to take the Annual Examination in order to be declared pass can be declared eligible for appearing at the Compartment Examination in one failing subject. Such a student shall be eligible to appear in the subject at a subsequent examination to be held in the third week of April known as the "Compartment Examination. However those students who are required to appear and pass in the exam for qualifying the additional failing subject, to qualify for appearing in class XII in that subject, may appear along with the students placed in the Compartment.

(d) If a student fails/ is absent in one subject and medical leave in other one or more subjects in Annual Exam, he/she may be eligible for the Compartment Examination in one failing subject and in the subjects for which he/she has submitted the medical certificate along with the students taking the Compartment Examination.

(e) If a student fails/ is absent in two or more than two subjects and medical leave in other one or more subjects in Annual Exam, he/she shall not be eligible for the Compartment Examination as the student is eligible for appearing at the Compartment Examination in only one failing subject (Rule 12 (a)).

14. Passing Criteria For Compartment Examination:

(a) In order to be declared "passed" in the Compartment Examination, a student must secure at least 33% marks in the subject in which he/she has taken the compartment exam. The promotion is also subject to the condition that he/she secures 33% marks separately in Practical/ Project Work/ Assessment of Speaking & Listening Skills (ASL)/ Communicative Skills etc also.

(b) If a student does not secure 33% marks in the subject(s) in which he/she has taken the Compartment Examination and in Practical/ Project Work/ Assessment of Speaking & Listening Skills (ASL)/ Communicative Skills etc (which is applicable) separately, he/she shall be declared unsuccessful in the Examination.

(c) No benefit of the grace marks will be given to the student appearing in Compartment Examination.

15. Fail:

A student who is not eligible for a Pass, Promotion or Compartment Examination either at the end of the session or for passing at the Compartment Examination, shall be declared "Fail" and detained in the same class during the next session.

16. General Instructions for Class IX & XI:

(a) In case of local transfer of students, record of marks obtained in the Mid Term Examination, if any, in the previous school shall be taken into account.

(b) In case of transfer from areas outside Delhi, marks obtained in subsequent exam shall be adjusted proportionately.

(c) In case of a natural calamity like floods, epidemics, riots or other such events in an area resulting in cancellation of Exam(s) in one or more subjects under orders of the Deputy Director of Education (District), marks in the subjects of the



students studying in schools located in the affected areas or residing in the affected areas shall be adjusted proportionately with the approval of the Director (Education) and the results be declared accordingly.

- (d) Fraction of the marks will be rounded of as mathematical formula: For Example: 8.1 to 8.4 are rounded of 08 and 8.5 to 8.9 is rounded of 09 in all the subjects and classes.
- (e) The first 5 subjects opted by a student are considered as main subjects and the result will be declared accordingly.

17. Rules Regarding Absence during Examination for Class IX & XI

- (a) Absence in the examination or part thereof without medical certificate to be submitted within three working days of the date of absence at the exam shall be considered as wilful absence and no mark, credit or allowance shall be given for the days of absence.
- (b) In case a student of Class IX & X is unable to appear at Periodic Assessment in one or more subjects on medical ground/ Late Admission/ Participating in National/ State/ International Games & Sports/ Participation in Independence Day/ Republic Day, Re-exam may be conducted at school level. However, average marks of best two out of three Periodic Assessments to be considered for promotion.
- (c) In case a student is unable to appear at Mid Term Examination in one or more subjects on medical ground (duly supported by a medical certificate as per circular NoDE.5/43/04/2013-14/Exam/1553-1558 dated 13/07/2015) issued by a degree holder Doctor or due to Late Admission(Duly approved by the Competent Authority)/ Participating in National/ State, International Games & Sports (Duly approved by the DDE (Sports), the Mid Term Exam may be ignored for computation of his/her result and promotion to the next higher class at the end of the session shall be made on the basis of the only Annual Examination.
- (d) A student of class IX on leave on medical grounds (duly supported by a medical certificate as per circular No. DE.5/43/04/2013-14/Exam/1553-1558 dated 13/07/2015 issued by a degree holder doctor) or Participating in National, State, International Games & Sports (Duly Approval of the DDE (Sports) in the Annual Examination in one or more subjects shall be allowed to take the exam in the subject(s) (In which he/she had been on leave on medical grounds) along with the students taking the Compartment Examination.
- (e) For such subjects (students will appear with compartmental student) rules of the Compartmental Examination will be applicable.

18. Attendance Criteria for Classes IX to XII

72/e

(a) Student shall not ordinarily be eligible to appear at any exam, if he/she has not put in at least 75% actual attendance of the total attendance during the session up to the date of each exam. The attendance for the session shall be counted for the working days from the date of admission (but not later than 31st July except the cases admitted after the declaration of Compartment Examination. For them the date of declaration of result of compartment examination will be treated as the date of admission) to the last day of the session.

(b) While calculating the percentage of actual attendance during the session, a student's actual attendance and total attendance in the previous school(s), if any, during the current session shall invariably be added to his actual attendance and the total attendance in the present school.


(c) If the date of commencement of the session in the State or UT from where the student has migrated, is different from the date of commencement of the session in the National Capital Territory of Delhi, the total and actual attendance shall be counted from the actual date of commencement of the session in that State/UT.

(d) Actual attendance with respect to the total attendance shall be intimated with the exam results to the parent or the guardian in respect of each exam.

(e) Percentage of attendance for each student shall be computed before Mid Term Exam. In case of shortage of attendance in Mid Term Exam, the student shall be allowed to take the exam on an undertaking from the parents or the guardian as well as from the student that the student shall in future be regular and will make up the shortage in attendance. He or she, however, shall be allowed to appear at the Annual Exam only under the provision of instructions of these rules.

(f) If the shortage of attendance at the time of the Annual examination is not more than 10%, in special circumstances of the case and if the Head of the School is satisfied with the genuineness of the reasons submitted by the student and his/her parent or guardian in written application for condonation of shortage to take the Annual Exam, the shortage of attendance up to 10% may be condoned by concerned Head of School. Application for condonation of shortage of attendance shall be submitted by the parent or the guardian of the student to the Head of the school by the last day of January.

(g) If the shortage of attendance at the time of Annual Examination is more than 10% but not more than 15% and the Head of the school is satisfied with the genuineness of the reasons of shortage submitted by the student and his parents or guardian, the Head of School may recommend, giving concrete and satisfactory reasons in writing thereof, his case for condonation of shortage of attendance to the DDE(Zone) concerned who may approve such condonation at his discretion and allow

the student to take the Annual Examination. Application for condonation of attendance shall be submitted by the parent or the guardian of the student to the Head of school by the last day of January.

(h) If the shortage of attendance at the time of the Annual Examination, for whatever reason or reasons, is more than 15%, i.e. the actual attendance of the student is less than 60% of the total attendance during the session, condonation of the shortage of attendance shall not be allowed, the student shall not be eligible to appear at the Annual Examination and shall be detained except in such cases as mentioned in the instructions.

(i) The Director (Education), at his/her discretion, may also make further condonation upto a maximum of 10% in the required minimum attendance percentage as a condition of eligibility to appear at the Annual Examination in exceptional circumstances created on medical grounds, such as student suffering from serious diseases like cancer, AIDS, TB or similar serious disease requiring long period of hospitalization or any other extra ordinary circumstances.


(j) The Director (Education), at his/her discretion, may make further relaxation upto a maximum of 10% in the required minimum attendance percentage as a condition of eligibility to appear at the Annual Examination in case of natural calamities like floods, earthquakes, epidemics etc. or in cases of dislocation of studies due to Government orders or riots or other such events in respect of students of schools located in the affected areas or the students residing in such areas provided that such a calamity had disrupted normal life in the concerned area for a period of more than 15 days. But such discretion shall not be used in individual cases.

(k) Head of School will ensure that no student of classes IX to XII (Below the attendance of 60%) will appear in the examination without the approval of the Director (Education). As per Rule 35 of DSEAR- 1973, the name of student may be struck off from the roll by head of school on account of continued absence without leave for six consecutive days by a student after giving the parents or guardian of such student a reasonable opportunity of showing cause against proposed action.

19. All the Govt. Govt Aided and Recognized Un-Aided Schools are required to comply with these instructions and no dilution of the criteria prescribed is permissible under any circumstances. However, if a recognized Unaided school desires to have more stringent criteria than those prescribed in these instructions, it can do so provided it has sought and obtained the prior approval of the Director of Education. All such requests are to be examined by the DDE (District) and forwarded to the Director (Education) with their observations and recommendations for approval latest by 30th April of the session or within one month of issuing this order for current academic session.



20. All the Govt., Govt Aided and Recognized Un-Aided Schools shall bring these instructions to the notice of the students and their parents/guardians immediately on the commencement of the session and in any case, by 15th of April or within 15 days of issuing this order for current academic session.


